All of current year 5 have had sports leader training again this year and 8 children have had sports crew training. This year's sports crew have been very active, running 2 lunchtime clubs a week and have been out on sporting events in a media role. Continued replenishment of equipment on the playground. As a result, active play has increased during play times and lunchtimes. Continued with an after school hockey club which continued throughout the year, averaging 20 children a session. This has increased from last year therefore this has led to greater participation in active sport. We also had an after school golf club with 10 children participating, this will continue in the new school year. Children across the whole school have participated in school games events including 16 inter school events and 8 intra school events. As a result over 90% of the children in the school participated in sport in some form. Children in reception and KS1 have participated in pacesetter games. Children in Reception and KS1 have received REAL gym and Real PE all year.	Our tracker showed a low level of activity throughout the school day so we have to increase the participation of children, especially those that are less active, at lunchtime activities. These are to be monitored and supervised by PE lead and PE support TA. Increase the number of intra house competitions and actively involve those children with SEN.
